

Mark Flood's Google Murder-Suicide Opens in New York

A look at the artist and Supreme collaborator's solo show

Texas-based artist and art world disruptor Mark Flood is back with another (bound to be hyped) solo show in *GOOGLE MURDER-SUICIDE*.



Flood's previous work includes his now-iconic show *Mark Flood Resents* at Chelsea's Zach Feuer gallery, where he created an entirely artist-run gallery, showroom, exhibition space and crash pad where the art was on display but not for sale. Mattresses were on the floor and it soon became the go-to hangout spot for NY's young contemporary artists including <u>Chloe Wise</u> and <u>Carly Mark</u> (and was live streamed 24/7 using four webcams).



Then there are the shows he's curated, including *Irrational Women* (which featured works by Ana Villagomez, Susie Rosmarin and Sharon Engelstein) and *Emotionally Unavailable Men* (which featured works by Paul Kremer and Chris Bexar).

GOOGLE MURDER-SUICIDE is a continuation of the artist's fascination with meme culture and gives a nod to Flood's anarchistic, punk-imbued works - kind of like if '77 punk met 4chan.

GOOGLE MURDER-SUICIDE is on until July 28 at Maccarone Gallery, NYC
